

Carol connected with the gentleman who made our new front desk and counter and talked with several staff on wood choices and a cross was made. When the new crucifix was brought in by the woodworker, he said, "I'm a Lutheran and go to church down the road; I love making things for you Catholics!"

What a special, interdenominational gift and a sign of Christ's fellowship that extends beyond our own parish limits. Let us continue to pray for Christian unity and recognize ourselves as united by the sacrifice of Jesus.

World Food Day is observed on October 16. WFD aims to promote healthy diets and eradicate hunger issues by 2030. Worldwide about 750 million people faced hunger in 2020. [fao.org]

- In the US more than 34 million people, including 9 million children, were food insecure in 2021. [USDA]
- In 2020 over 400,000 people were food insecure in Oregon. [feedingamerica.org]
- The Food Bank estimates that this year, 1 in 5 Josephine County residents are food insecure; 1 in 4 are children.

- Support organizations that help those who need food help.
- Support local agencies that provide food assistance such as the St Vincent de Paul Social Service Office, the Salvation Army, and the ROC.

CELEBRATING OUR SAINTS



ST HEDWIG (1174 - 1243), born in Bavaria, was married at age 12 to Duke Henry of Silesia. Known for her kindness to the poor, she founded a hospital for lepers and welcomed travelers, the homeless and the sick and the dying into her castle. She also visited the poor and attended to their

needs. Her people considered her a living saint. When Henry died in 1238 she joined a Cistercian convent and stayed until her death. Many miracles were reported after she died.

She was ST ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY'S aunt.

Her Feast Day is October 16
