God's love

Last weekend, during Families of Faith, our middle-schoolers discussed God's love and the problem of sin in the world. Not only have I been fascinated by this question, but I've had the great honor of learning from Fr. Daniel Harrington, an incredible Scripture scholar who wrote what I consider the best, most approachable book on the topic: "Why Do We Suffer? A Scriptural Approach to the Human Condition." In his epilogue, he writes:

"The memory of Jesus can be dangerous. It calls into question many of the easy assumptions about life, happiness, and success that most people hold. It confronts us with the realities of misunderstanding, injustice, and innocent suffering. It reminds us that even the one whom we confess to be the Son of God had to struggle to accept God's will made manifest in the grim realities of the cross. And yet the memory of Jesus also places before us the hope that God can and does bring life out of suffering and death, and reminds us that suffering and death never have the last word in the Bible."

Fr. Ron Rolheiser posits, "Perhaps ['How can there be an all-loving and an all-powerful God if there is so much suffering and evil in our world?'] is the most difficult religious question of all time."

What amazed me last weekend was that by simply, deeply pouring over the first reading from last week's Mass, Wisdom 11:22-12:2, our middle-schoolers were able to enter into this mystery and find solid truths. "For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made" "But you spare all things, because they are yours ... for your imperishable spirit is in all things!" All is God's creation. And when the mark is missed, it and the suffering that comes with it is permitted because of the potential for authentic reconciliation to right-relationship. We have a God of relationship and so we can look to our relationships to see this truth. Parents, don't you respond to the faults of your children with nourishment and hope that they grow to be people of character? So, too, does our loving and living God continually seek deep relationship with we children.

8:00 am-8:30 am Saturday November 12

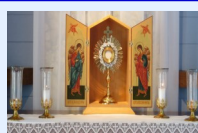

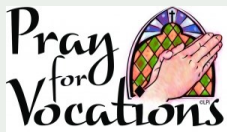
Men's Bible Study Group

CELEBRATING OUR SAINTS

BL JOHN DUNS SCOTUS (c. 1266 - 1308), was born in Duns, Scotland, and joined the Franciscans. After ordination he earned a Doctorate in Theology. Known as the "Subtle Doctor," he was one of the most influential philosopher-theologians of the High Middle Ages. He was beatified by St John Paul II in 1993.

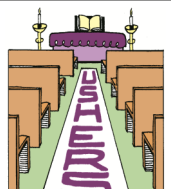

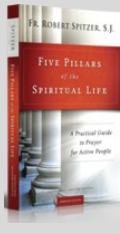
