There once was a young Jewish man wanting to be holy who went to his Rabbi and said, "I think I reached holiness." "Why do you think that?" asked the Rabbi. "Well," responded the young man, "All day long, I work hard for others. If I have temptations, I roll in thorn bushes until they go away. I have disciplined myself even lashing my back so as to become holy." The Rabbi was silent for a time. Then he led the man to a window and pointed to an old horse. "I've noticed this horse has to do work for people and isn't thanked. I often see it rolling around in bushes, as horses are prone to do, and frequently I see it get whipped. But I ask you: Is that a saint or a horse?"

Fr. Ron Rolheiser uses this story to highlight that, while our actions matter, there is more to being a saint. We must "be motivated by gratitude." Fr. Rolheiser goes on to say, "Scripture, everywhere and always, makes this point. For example, the sin of Adam and Eve was, first and foremost, a failure in receptivity and gratitude. God gives them life, each other and the garden and asks them only to receive it properly, in gratitude.... To be properly grateful, is the most primary of all religious attitudes. Proper gratitude is ultimate virtue. It defines sanctity. Saints, holy persons, are people who are grateful, people who see and receive everything as a gift."

Even the Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith, derives its name from the Greek root for "thanksgiving." Pope Francis says, "Above all, let us not forget to thank. If we are bearers of gratitude, the world itself will become better...." Let this be our goal this season.

It has been written that there is no way any of us can sit in the presence of the Holy Eucharist and not be transformed. Ready to be transformed?

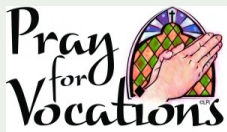
Starting on December 3, 2022 and every first Friday from then on, there will be Exposition of the Holy Eucharist in the church from 8:30 am until 1 pm. Exposition will be followed by Benediction.

To ensure the safety of the Presence, there must be a minimum of three people in the church during Exposition. If you can commit yourself for one hour during the assigned hours please contact the volunteers who will be taking names after all Masses this weekend.

Exposition in the Adoration Chapel will continue Monday through Friday, 9:30 am to noon, when the Parish Office is open with the exception of the first Friday of the month.

The Adoration Chapel is available to parishioners 7 days a week, 24 hours per day. It is secured by a keypad. If you have not visited the Chapel before please call the office for the code.

ST CLEMENT served as the 4th Pope. He is known as one of the five “Apostolic Fathers.” In an effort to heal a rift between the people of Corinth and the Church, he wrote a letter encouraging peace and harmony that was widely read in the early Church:

“...Charity unites us to God. It knows no schism, does not rebel, does all things in concord. In charity all the elect of God have been made perfect...”
Pope Clement was martyred in 99 or 101.

His Feast Day is November 23

HOW TO SHARE YOUR FAITH WITH ANYONE – BOOK

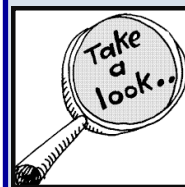
