Okay.... Funny thing: when I first joined the staff here at St. Anne Catholic Church, I was asked to lead a prayer before a meeting. Having ample notice, I wrote a prayer based on my reflection at the time and what was on my heart. One line that stood out to me from a webinar on the Church in the 21st century and in light of COVID was, "Now is the time to fail and fail quickly." We're in a period of transition and trying new things. Not everything is going to work! Why do I bring this up? Well, because the feedback I got is, "We miss your reflections in the bulletin and we're getting the novena on Facebook. Start reflecting again!" Ha ha! Well, alright. I guess I failed. Thank God it was quick!

Since last I shared, several new and exciting things have happened. We began our Novena for Youth and Families. Steve Plymale and I have been organizing it and, if you've been joining us or following online, you'll have noticed each week has a theme and time for conversational prayer with God (sometimes called "extemporaneous prayer"). It's been a small group that has been joining but each week more people are coming. Several people have told me they are praying along through Facebook. The reason for the novena is to pray for the ministries that directly impact families and youth.

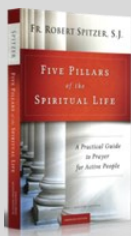
The school year began and with it the excitement of a campus of kids running around. I was so excited to join the fifth grade class in preparing music for our Mass of the Holy Spirit. This is the first time we've had such a Mass as far as I know. It is a tradition of many Catholic schools to have a special first Mass of the academic year in which we call upon the Holy Spirit to inspire us. You should have heard the heartfelt and prayerful singing of "Alleluia! Love is Alive" by Steve Agrisano!

I'm thrilled with our new Families of Faith program. It is already reaching a significant number of families in just its first few sessions and the time spent with parents is invaluable. We've now had two prep sessions which intend to provide insight and support to parents on how to witness and share their faith with their children. We've also had our first monthly community day which was very casual and allowed us to play some games together and connect. Soon we'll have our first sacramental preparation session and I'm excited for that. We have one of the largest groups preparing for Confirmation in some time. I see this ministry as the mustard seed that will overtake the garden of St. Anne. Imagine every family on fire for our Lord and equipped to share it with the world because it was shared in the home! I believe the littlest members of this group will be our active and vibrant high school and young adult ministry in the coming years!

There's honestly so much more to share, but I hope this gets us somewhat caught up. Know that you're in my thoughts and prayers and watch for more updates here going forward.

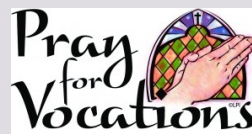

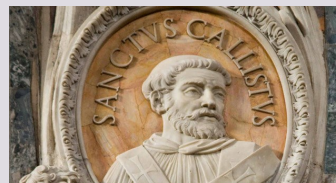

CELEBRATING OUR SAINTS



ST CALLISTUS (d. 222), was born into slavery to a Christian master who, seeing that Callistus had financial skills, made him manager of a bank. When

the bank failed he was falsely accused of embezzlement. After he was released from his sentence, the Pope put him in charge of the burial grounds. He was ordained a Deacon, and in 217 was elected Pope over the protests of his rival, Hippolytus, who became the first antipope. Callistus advocated forgiveness for repentant sinners while Hippolytus disagreed, favoring a stricter approach. Callistus was martyred in a riot.

His Feast Day is October 14
