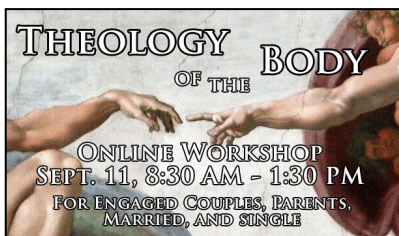

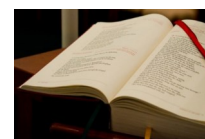

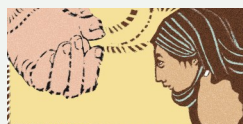

### CELEBRATING THE SAINTS



#### ST ROSE OF VITERBO (1233 - 1251),

was born in Viterbo, Italy, to a poor but devout family. At age 10 she joined the Third Order of St Francis and began preaching about penance in the streets. At age 15 she tried to enter the Poor Clares monastery but was turned away. After she was turned away a second time she prophesied that she would enter not in this life but the next. Rose died at age 18 from a heart condition. In 1257 the Pope ordered Rose's body exhumed and reburied in the monastery, which he renamed after her. Her body is in an incorrupt state.

Her Feast Day is September 4th

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of **continuing participation in God's creation**. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then **the basic rights of workers must be respected** - the right to **productive work**, to **decent and fair wages**, to the organization and **joining of unions**, to **private property**, and to **economic initiative**. - **We were created with a vocation to work.**
- The goal **should not be that technological progress increasingly replaces human work**, for this would be detrimental to humanity.
- **Work is a necessity**, part of the meaning of life on this earth, a path to growth, human development and personal fulfillment.
- **Helping the poor financially must always be a provisional solution** in the face of pressing needs. The broader objective should always be to allow them a dignified life through work.

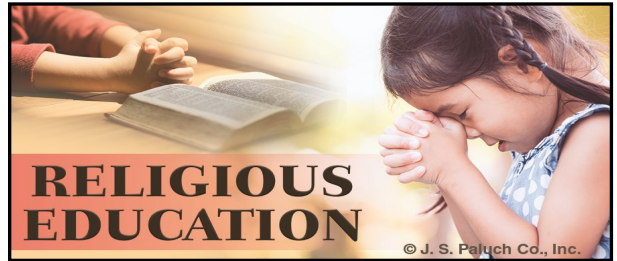

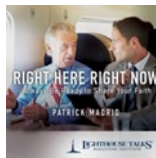

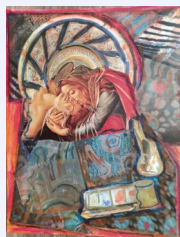

I believe this part of the statement encompasses our Greeters – we are the first persons you encounter as you enter our church. We want to make you feel welcome and loved as you enter. 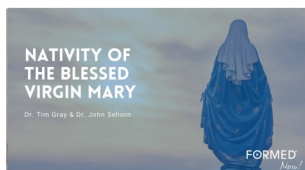

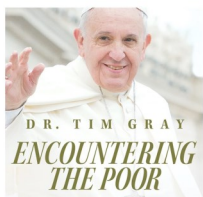
