All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday, & Good Friday.

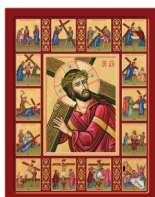
All Catholics between ages 18 & 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

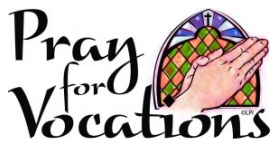

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

ST VINCENT FERRER (1350 - 1419) was born in Valencia, Spain, and entered the Dominicans at 19. He taught philosophy and was a gifted preacher, called the “mouthpiece of God.” He worked to unify the Church during the Western Schism, when Popes in Avignon and Rome both claimed to be the true Pope. Unable to end the schism, Vincent spent the next 20 years working miracles and preaching the Gospel throughout Europe. When he was close to death he denounced the Avignon Pope and encouraged loyalty to the true Pope in Rome. The Council of Constance subsequently ended the schism.

Third Station: Jesus Falls the First Time

Anna, from Kyiv: On that day, around our house, literally in front of the gate, there was a bunch of Russian military equipment. For a long time they just stood there. Then they began to move. Along the way, they fired at residential buildings. They didn't move fast, they shot thoroughly.

The children and I hid in some corner under the stairs, away from the windows, crouched on the floor, trying to contain our panic.

Lord, grant us a feeling of horror.

Fourth Station: Jesus Meets His Mother

Kateryna, from Lugansk: When food shortages arose, people appeared who distributed milk and bread and pastries for free.

Once, as the shelling began, a frail young woman with a tiny baby ran to where milk was being distributed. She was given 2 packets and offered more. She hesitated and said she had another child, but will others have enough. She took the third carton of milk only after she was convinced there was enough for everyone.

At a time when Russian soldiers are deliberately shooting at children's hospitals, kindergartens, cars with people, crushing civilians with tanks, a tiny mother of two, under the roar of shots, is worried that someone else nearby will have enough food. It was the first time in all my days that I cried.

Lord, teach us to be generous.



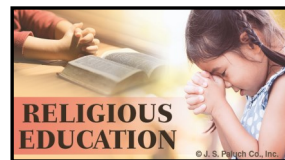

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Next weekend, many churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a *lulav*, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the *lulav*, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the *Hoshanot*, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches today, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, what do you think would be the best choice to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?

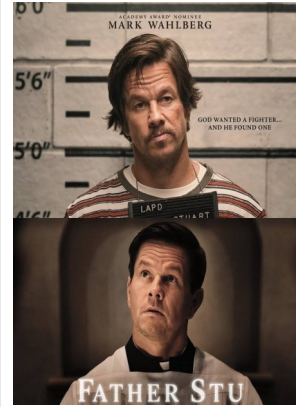

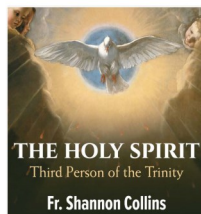
