

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

ST JOSAPHAT (c. 1580 - 1623), born in present-day Ukraine, became a Basilian monk, then a Priest in the Byzantine Church. He was well known as a preacher and an ascetic. In his thirties he became a Bishop, then Archbishop. Raised in the

Byzantine culture, he worked for reunion with the Church of Rome. Though he had support among the Orthodox, strong groups opposed Rome and Latin rule. Despite warnings he went to a hotbed of trouble, where a riot broke out. The man who dedicated his life to unity was killed by an angry mob.

His Feast Day is November 12th

Cooperation and Discernment at the
UN Climate Conference, COP26
October 31 - November 12**

**The climate crisis is complex and demands the
discernment and cooperation of the entire human family.**

- The Administration recently committed to reduce carbon dioxide and methane emissions and to increase climate finance contributions to low-income countries.
- These new developments reflect an integral ecology that promotes care for creation and strengthens the bonds of solidarity between nations.
- COP26 is an opportunity for all nations to protect the environment while at the same time providing reliable, affordable and carbon free energy through innovation and enterprise, ensuring a better future for the entire human family.
- Pope Francis spoke of the "ecological debt" developed nations must pay, "not only by significantly limiting their consumption of non-renewable energy or by assisting poorer countries to enact policies and programs of sustainable development, but also by covering the costs of the innovation required for that purpose."

We unite with the Holy Father in upholding the Church's teaching that creation is a precious gift of God intended to be shared by all. To protect this gift, as the world races towards a sustainable future, we must not forget those who suffer the greatest harm from ecological degradation. Climate leadership requires finding common ground in the pursuit of the common good, for the entire planet is our one common home.




Join us in thanking our veterans on Thursday, November 11th. On Behalf of the staff, students and families of






