There's a different pace to a summer Sunday, especially on those days when we dream of air conditioning and wave any available paper to stir the air. Yet we persist in gathering, even with so many breaks from the usual routines. We distance ourselves not only from routines, but from schedules and familiar well-worn paths. These are playful days and contemplative days. We see long-lost friends and visit almost-forgotten places. We have more leisure than any people before in the history of the world, and we need it because our lives are so care-worn and tiring. More of us walk barefoot and look up at the stars or dip our toes in the lake or sea, sing around campfires, read novels on the beach, and eat comfort food with our fingers. We see how beautiful life can be, and are more aware than usual of how God is always breaking in with signs of love.

In Genesis today, Abraham and Sarah practice hospitality to their visitors, who turn out to be God dropping in. During the summer months, God practices hospitality in return, inviting us into a season of celebration. Keeping Sunday holy is a good habit to cultivate in these days when our spirits are especially receptive to God's deep desire for us to know divine love.

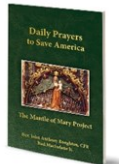

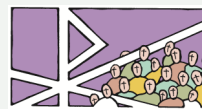

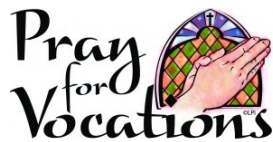

**CELEBRATING THE SAINTS**

**ST MARY MAGDALENE (d. 63)**, was born in Magdala, a village on the shore of Lake Tiberias. Mary was one of Jesus' disciples, reported in Luke 8:2 as the one from whom He cast out 7 demons. She has been mistakenly identified as the woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears (Lk 7:38). Mary was present at the crucifixion, and was the first to see and speak with the risen Jesus. Mistaking Him for the gardener, she realized it was Jesus when He called her by name. Because she brought news of His resurrection to the Apostles, she is known as the “Apostle to the Apostles.”

**LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE****Immigration Update****Migrant Protection Protocols (MPP)**

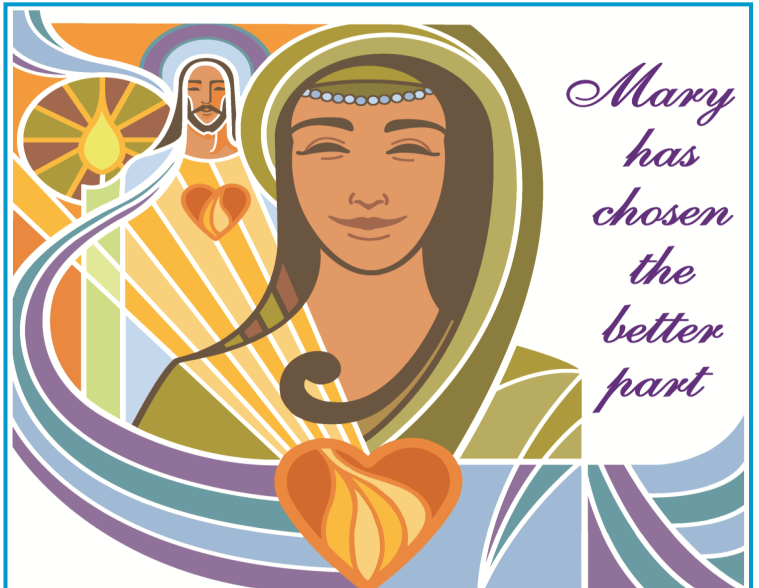
On June 30th the US Supreme Court issued its decision on the MPP Program, also known as **Remain in Mexico**. Under this Program, established in 2019, asylum-seekers must remain in Mexico until their asylum claims are reviewed. The Court held that the administration has the discretion to release them into the US while their cases are pending, and that it had the authority to terminate MPP. Another Court will determine whether the government followed the proper procedures in terminating the Program.

**From USCCB:**

Today's decision recognizes and preserves the executive branch's ability to reverse untenable, illegal, and immoral policies, regardless of who is in office....**With this ruling, we welcome the end of MPP....**We remain committed to supporting immigration policies that produce more sustainable solutions, **respect the God-given dignity of migrants, and better reflect Christ's call to welcome the stranger.**

**Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)**

On July 6th oral argument was held on the administration's appeal from a court in Texas that ruled that **the DACA Program was implemented illegally**. Under DACA certain undocumented immigrants who entered the US as children - **“Dreamers” - can remain in the US, protected from removal and eligible to work** among other benefits. More than 600,000 Dreamers are enrolled in the Program. The Court of Appeals decision in this case will likely be appealed to the Supreme Court.

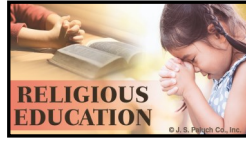

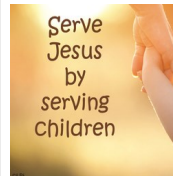
## FAITH FORMATION

### **Reflection question:**

How has the Lord shown favor to me?

Dear families,

It really feels like summer, doesn't it? Just this last weekend, our family got to enjoy some sunshine in the evening and play in the sprinkler in the backyard. We also got to pick blueberries with some other families who attend St. Anne. We should totally make that a thing and get a large group together sometime! But I digress. The social media post of this message would probably highlight the great photos from the weekend with smiling faces, fist full of blueberries and some icy drinks on a backyard table while sprinkler mist keeps everyone cool. We tend to gloss over that for many families, summers usually means more time in close proximity with our family. And with so much time together, along with several months of growth, summers sometimes include struggles, tantrums and the like.

Here's a little advice that was shared with me: Catholic families should fight fair. As much as we wish family life were perfect, the reality is that all families experience conflict. We're going to fight. Families that fight fair, carry with them an application of the Ten Commandments, even when they are in the middle of a family crisis. Some examples: Steering clear of using the Lord's name in vain in a heated debate. Honoring mothers and fathers (and daughters and sons and sisters and brothers and so on). Telling the truth, gently, even though it may hurt.

Family members who fight for personal victory miss out on how great it feels to work through a struggle together, and win as a team. When our families are at their best, they are able to check tempers, are respectful of each other's strengths and weaknesses, and always remember that obstacles make us stronger. Arguments can be wonderful opportunities for dialogue. And through dialogue, we can better understand one another and God. And it takes practice!

God bless all our families and help us in all our dialogue.

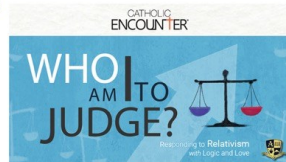
