Dear Parishioners,

Thanksgiving

I hope this letter finds you amidst the joys and peace of being with family and/or friends on this Thanksgiving Day weekend. If you find yourself suffering from "Tryptophan poisoning" induced by your Thanksgiving Day turkey dinner, then rest assured, you are not alone. I may end up asleep watching football, a tradition that I like to participate in on this day of gratitude. Seriously, it is wonderful that our country has enshrined a day for us to be mindful of all the amazing things we have in our lives here in the U.S. Maybe we could all offer a prayers that we would be open to an attitude of gratitude in the days that follow and well into the new year.

Advent

This weekend also begins our preparatory season of Advent. In this season we are being encouraged by the Church to prepare our hearts not only for the celebration of the first Advent of Christ (Christmas), but also for the Second Advent of Christ (The End Time). Both events call us to be people of repentance. We see this in the color of purple amidst our environment as well as an encouragement to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Fr. Stephen and myself will be making confessions more available by offering a daytime block on Wednesday, December 22nd, 9:30am-12:00pm as well as adding an hour to our Saturday confession times. That means we will begin hearing confessions in the church on the Saturdays of Advent an hour earlier than normal: 2:30 PM instead of 3:30 PM (December 4th, 11th, 18th).

Prayer

Beginning on the First Sunday in Advent (November 28th), our Parish Leadership Team (PLT) will begin offering time to be prayed with at St. Anne after the 11 AM Mass each Sunday. This will be a new outreach to our parishioners and anyone else who attends the 11 AM Mass to know that God desires to comfort us, help us, and lift us up. Our Team, myself, Fr. Stephen Kenyon, Sandra Lopez, Kathy Nelson, and Bill Bailey, will be available to you for such prayer. All they will ask is your name and what you would like them to pray about. They may ask if they can put their hand on your shoulder in order to help you feel the comfort of your loving family here at St. Anne. This is certainly a new approach of outreach to our community and for our PLT also. Please keep the PLT in your prayers, as we continue to discern our own role as parish leaders following the promptings of the Holy Spirit. In time, we hope this may expand to the other Masses on the weekend.

I am so thankful for the communities of St. Anne, Our Lady of the River, and St. Patrick of the Forest. Let us be ever mindful of the gifts that God has given us, ever aware that our Lord's return gets closer each day, and respond as stewards, giving of our time, talent, and treasure.

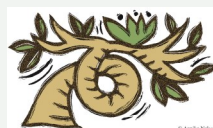

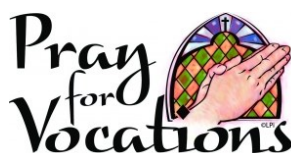

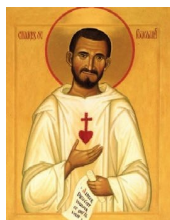

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

BL CHARLES DE FOUCAULD (1858 - 1916), born in



France, rejected the Catholic faith, joined the French army, went to the Holy Land, regained his faith and joined a Trappist monastery. He worked for Poor Clare nuns, was ordained, spent 15 years in the desert hoping to establish a religious community, then lived among the Tuareg people in Algeria. During WWI he was killed by Tuareg rebels. His peaceful, largely hidden and hospitable life inspired several religious congregations. He will be Canonized on May 15, 2022.

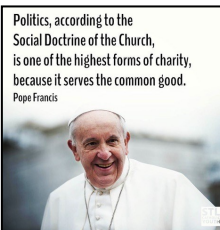

Civilize It: A Better Kind of Politics

As a Church and a nation, we are polarized and divided. Pope Francis challenges us to respond by **building “a better kind of politics, one truly at the service of the common good”** (Fratelli Tutti, No. 154), one that **“seeks the good of all people”** (F.T. No 182).

By “a better kind of politics” Pope Francis is not just referring to partisan activities during election season, but any **activity in which we can bring the light of our faith to the public square to further solidarity, justice and the common good - what he calls “political charity”** - such as

- involvement in local government and school board meetings, and
- understanding how funding is allocated and the major issues facing our community.

Civilize It: A Better Kind of Politics is a nonpartisan initiative from the USCCB seeking to assist Catholics to **counter polarization and division in the Church and society by following the example of the Good Samaritan**, who challenges us to “become neighbors to all” (F.T. No. 80). This initiative seeks to engage families and communities in **dialogue and bridge building in pursuit of the common good**:

- By overcoming division and promoting encounters with our neighbors,
 - By seeing ourselves as members of one human family,
 - By listening to understand and identifying common values, and
 - By jointly coming up with solutions to problems facing our community and world.

To the St. Anne Catholic Church parishioners from St. Anne Catholic School staff and families. We pray you had a blessed time with family and friends, stayed safe and healthy, and had time to focus on all the things you have to be thankful for. At St. Anne school, we have much to be thankful for, and want to take this time to share with our St. Anne family.

November 19th was the first day for current families to apply for tuition assistance for the 2022/2023 school year. Yes, you read that right. It is actually difficult to type “2022/2023” and I keep having to correct it as I automatically type 2021/2022! As things change in the public school system, we have more and more families calling to ask about enrolling for this year (though most classes are closed) and if not, then asking when they can enroll for next year. Shawna has already given tours to prospective families for next year and we have many on the waitlist if we happen to have an opening this year.

December 1st will be the first day for current families to register for the 22/23 school year. January 1 will be the first day for new families to apply for the 22/23 school year. We anticipate that our classes will fill up quickly, so we are encouraging families to register early. Along with registration comes the need for tuition assistance. In prior years, we did not know how much assistance we would be able to provide until later in March or April. With the demand for enrollment so high, we need to have a good idea of the availability of funds much earlier than in past years. This continues to be one of St. Anne’s greatest needs. While we have many families who are fortunate enough to be able to pay full tuition, we have many more families who realistically cannot afford anything at all, and whatever they do pay for tuition is a huge sacrifice for the family. Therefore, we ask that you consider partnering with us through regular donations.

Thanks to the Joseph Weston Foundation, every year we have the opportunity to have donations matched, dollar for dollar, up to a certain amount, for tuition assistance. For the 22/23 school year, the maximum matching amount will be \$35,000. This means that for every parishioner who donates weekly, monthly or yearly to the school’s general fund, we receive up to \$35,000 from the Joseph Weston Foundation that we use for tuition assistance. Other important donors for assistance are our endowment fund, which provided \$25,000 this year, several parishioners who give monthly for tuition assistance, the Joseph Weston Foundation that gives for need-based assistance (\$21,000 this year), and other foundations such as the Koch and Kremer Foundations and the Archdiocese of Portland Block Grant. This year, we have awarded just under \$125,000 in tuition assistance to 53 of our 87 elementary students.

As our school grows, the needs grow as well. We are so thankful for the grant funds we have received this and last year during the pandemic, and those dollars have been instrumental in the development of the school’s infrastructure. This year, grant funds have allowed us to replace our outdated technology, replace old and broken furniture, outfit new classrooms, hire an additional teacher, and have both a part time and a full time learning specialist. However, those grants are restricted to specific use and once they are gone, we are left to continue supporting the foundation of the school - staffing and building/grounds - that these grant funds have allowed us to put into place. That is what makes the support of our parish and parishioners so very important. As we continue to grow, we are more and more thankful for the support of this parish. Please join with us in prayers of thanksgiving for all the ways in which God has blessed us.

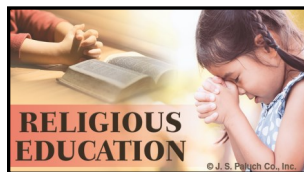

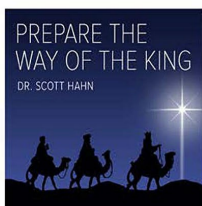

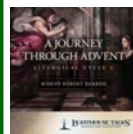
