



All Saints (November 1) TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we celebrate the saints who live in glory, and the vast number of people who have gone before us in the Christian life as "works in progress." Reading any saint's biography, you quickly become aware that they were persons singularly aware of their faults and sins, their human propensity to miss the mark. Penance is a recurring theme in their lives, and many found a "confessor" who coached them in the spiritual life.

Today, a new form of penance can coach us in our journey, because the setting is an assembly of the faithful. In this form, there is time given for people who wish to confess and be absolved to meet privately with a priest for a few moments. Before the community is dismissed, everyone joins in an act of praise for God's mercy, usually by singing a hymn together. The individual part is not compulsory, and you can certainly participate fully and fruitfully without the individual confession. The joy of this liturgy is itself an impetus to change and to open up more fully to this wonderful gift of our faith. You have already been forgiven, of course. That was accomplished for you on the cross. It is the Christian task to open ourselves up, as did the saints, to the reality of that gift.

All Souls' Day (November 2) TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

For those of Mexican heritage, November 2 means celebration of el Dia de Los Muertos, or "the Day of the Dead." One of the most important days of the year for many, they join All Saints and All Souls together, visiting the graves of babies and children on All Saints, since they are santitos (little saints) or angelitos (little angels). Flowers, their favorite toys, favorite music, and so on, are taken to them. The following day, people spend time—some of them all day—at the cemetery with their loved ones who have died. From the ancient customs of the Indians the families pray, talk with them, and take them their favorite food. It is a most solemn but joyful day. It is a day to celebrate Christ's victory over death: "Death, where is your sting?" There is a mocking of death as people make skeletons, candy that represents death, and Pan del los Muertos (bread of the dead) and consume them in a kind of role reversal.

One of the customs is to build an *altarcito* (little altar) where one places mementos and pictures of those who have died. There are also favorite foods, candles, statues or pictures of favorite saints, books, and Bibles. Some parishes have begun to build an *altarcito* where all parishioners can join in honoring the deceased. A remembrance book can be placed to write names in. The *altarcito* is traditionally left up for the month of November.



LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE **Update on Abortion Cases**

On October 22 the US Supreme Court deferred action on the Administration's emergency request to block the Texas abortion law, thus allowing the law to remain in effect. The Court scheduled an expedited hearing on **November 1st** to consider the law's wording, the Federal government's right to challenge it, and whether it should be blocked until the case is resolved.

- The Texas law, which took effect on September 1st, bans abortions after a fetal heartbeat is detected, or about 6 weeks of pregnancy.
- The law authorizes private citizens to sue any person involved in performing or aiding and abetting an abortion.
- In 1973 the Supreme Court legalized abortion in Roe v Wade, ruling that states cannot restrict abortions before viability, or about 24 weeks of pregnancy.
- The only issue so far is whether or not the Texas law should be blocked. The Court is **not expected to rule on** the law's constitutionality on November 1st.

However, on December 1st the Supreme Court will hear arguments in the biggest abortion case to come before the Court in 30 years. The case involves a Mississippi law that bans abortions after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Since the law's constitutionality is before the Court, one possible outcome is to overturn Roe v Wade. A decision is expected next June.



FEAST OF FAITH Prayer after Communion

The rites following the reception of Communion are very short. It is as if the Church is saying to us that the only way to respond to this great gift is to go forth and live it! But there are some significant rites yet before we are sent forth from the Mass. After Communion, we pray together in silence or sing a hymn; both are ways to thank God for the gift of the Son. Then the priest prays another collect, the Prayer after Communion. This prayer, usually very short, gathers our prayers into one. It reminds us of what we have already experienced: in receiving the Eucharist, we have received a foretaste of the heavenly banquet; we have eaten the bread of angels. This reality, this knowledge, should transform us, so that we may journey through this life with our hearts set on eternal life, and find in the Eucharistwhich is food from heaven and daily bread—the strength and hope we need to work toward God's kingdom of justice here and now.

LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O LORD, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.


