Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agajanian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharisic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed!



CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

ST JOHN VIANNEY (1786 - 1859), born in France,



entered the seminary at 19 but struggled because his education was disrupted by the French Revolution. He was ordained at 29 and assigned to the Parish of Ars. Finding that parishioners were careless about their faith, he worked hard to reconcile them with God. He was strict with them but harder on himself. He spent 10-15 hours a day hearing confessions. So many people came from all over France and other countries that the government built a railroad line to Ars. He

spent long days serving everyone. He was also known as the champion of the poor. Patron Saint of Parish Priests.

Nuclear Disarmament




At 8:15 AM on August 6, 1945, the United States detonated the first atomic bomb used in war over Hiroshima, Japan. A second atomic bomb was detonated over Nagasaki at 11:02 AM on August 9th. Over 100,000 people died immediately.

From Pope Francis' Address in Hiroshima and Nagasaki (2019):

The use of atomic energy for purposes of war is a crime against humanity and immoral. So too the possession of nuclear weapons is immoral. A world of peace, free from nuclear weapons, is the aspiration of millions of men and women everywhere. To make this ideal a reality calls for involvement on the part of all: individuals, religious communities and civil society, countries that possess nuclear weapons and those that do not, the military and private sectors, and international organizations.

The Catholic Church is irrevocably committed to promoting peace. I ask you to pray each day for the conversion of hearts and for the triumph of a culture of life. reconciliation and fraternity. In this striking place of remembrance that stirs us from our indifference, it is all the more meaningful that we turn to God with trust, asking him to teach us to be effective instruments of peace and to make every effort not to repeat the mistakes of the past.

"We must not give up the dream of a world without wars. May all the peoples of the earth enjoy the joy of peace!" **Pope Francis**



Last week, I talked about how wonderful I find it to hear the voices (even the cries) of our littlest Catholics in the pews at Mass. This week, I want to share some tips for parents that were curated by the

Archdiocese of Portland in both English and Spanish:

Relax. God put the wiggle in children; Don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house.

Relájese. Dios puso el movimiento en los niños; No sienta el tener que reprimirlos en la Iglesia.

Sit towards the front or aisle where it is easier for little ones to see and hear.

Siéntese hacia el frente o hacia el pasillo donde es más fácil que los pequeños vean y oigan.

Quietly **explain** the parts of the Mass. Calladamente **explique** las partes de la Misa.

Sing the hymns and **pray** the prayers together. Children learn from your actions.

Canten los himnos y oren Juntos. Los niños aprenden de sus acciones.

If you must leave Mass with your child, feel free to do so, but please **come back**. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me" (Mt 19:14).


