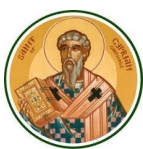
CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

STS CORNELIUS (d. 253) AND CYPRIAN (d. 258),
friends who during times of Christian persecution served as Pope and Bishop.



21 - St. CORNELIUS

CORNELIUS was elected Pope after the martyrdom of ST FABIAN. His greatest challenge was dealing with Christians who gave up their faith during the persecution. He ordered that they could be restored to the Church with the usual “medicines of repentance.” After 2 years as Pope he was arrested and died in exile.



CYPRIAN converted to Christianity as an adult, was made a Priest and then Bishop of Carthage. He also had to deal with the treatment of apostates. When new persecutions broke out he was arrested and martyred.

**LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE****Immigration Update -
Remain in Mexico Policy**

On August 24th the US Supreme Court ruled that the Administration must **comply with a Texas Court decision requiring it to reinstate the Migration Protection Protocols (MPP) program, aka the Remain in Mexico Policy.** This program, which was established in 2019, forces those seeking asylum in the US to remain in Mexico while their asylum claims are being adjudicated.

- The program was **terminated by the Department of Homeland Security in June, 2021.** The States of Texas and Missouri filed a lawsuit challenging the DHS decision. In ruling against the Administration, mainly on procedural grounds, the **Texas Court ordered that the MPP program be reinstated.**
- These rulings do not prevent the Administration from trying to terminate the program again. **The DHS has already stated that it intends to do so, while continuing to challenge the Texas Court's order to reinstate MPP.**
- The DHS authority to prohibit the entry of persons who post a risk to public health (eg., covid), known as **Title 42 border policy**, is not affected by these rulings.

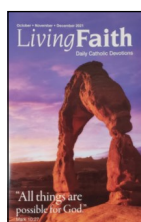
MPP is contrary to domestic and international law, which provide a legal right to seek asylum and protect against refoulement - the process of sending refugees and asylum seekers to any territory where they are likely to face threats to their life or freedom based on certain characteristics. **MPP is also contrary to Catholic Social Teaching, which calls for migrants to be welcomed and protected in accordance with their God-given dignity.**

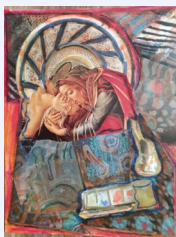
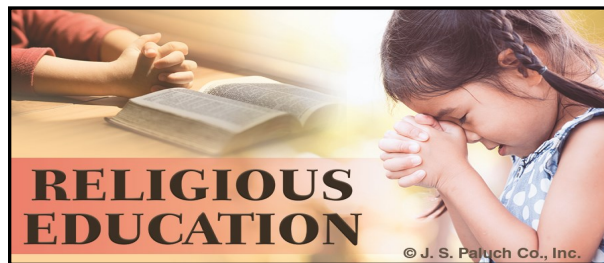

IT'S ALL ABOUT CONTROL

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message.

James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our self-mastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. We are asked to let God take the lead and to control the results, even though we may never see those results.

**GREETERS****"THE UNKNOWN MINISTRY"**

My name is Gail Travers, some of you may know me as one of the Greeters at the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday evening.

I have been greeting for many years and I always look forward to seeing you as you come through the doors of St. Anne Church. It has been such a joy for me and gives me the opportunity to give you a smile and a hug (before COVID came on the scene). I have been blessed to become a friend of many of you and have gotten to know you and your families – often to meet your families visiting from other states and meeting new parishioners and visitors stopping by on their vacations.

Greeters Ministry is probably the most unknown and misunderstood ministry. Most people think we are there to say "Hi", and welcome all entering our St. Anne Church doors. I believe this part of the statement encompasses our Greeters – we are the first persons you encounter as you enter our church. We want to make you feel welcome and loved as you enter. Being a Greeter is a true ministry of the church. This brief moment (30 Minutes) before Mass, will hopefully make you smile and be happy as you enter our church and prepare to receive our Lord's Precious Body and Blood.

If you, or someone you know, would like to try out being a Greeter, please see me before or after the Saturday 5:00 p.m. or Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass or call me. I am sure you will find that being a Greeter is a very spiritual and enjoyable experience for only 30 minutes of your time before Mass.

May the Holy Spirit guide you in your discernment on becoming a Greeter for St. Anne Church.

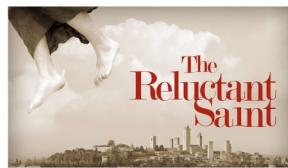
