### Thank You

Many people have been waiting for two years either building up a storehouse of crafting goods to be donated to the Bazaar or waiting to go shopping for that perfect hand-made item that they will enjoy for years. A shout out and thanks to this year's coordinator, Susan Finley. She joins a lineage of people who have shouldered the burden and joy of putting it together. A thank you is needed to all those who have been meeting continuously over the past many months to make the amazing crafts possible! Thank you also to the kitchen crew who offered us cinnamon rolls and turkey dinner! I also want to thank our Evangelization Team who hosted our Open House which accompanied the Bazaar. It, too, was a huge success.

### November, A Month of Remembrance

We are now well into November, kicked off by our celebrations of All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Traditionally in the Church, the whole month of November commemorates those who have died. Our culture, unfortunately, prefers a more antiseptic approach to death which often finds families not offering funerals for their loved ones. And while we certainly should be celebrating the lives of our deceased loved ones, it is highly problematic to either ignore or pretend that we are mourning. It is not a bad thing to mourn, but rather a healthy part of healing. We don't like mourning and would prefer avoiding it. But, if we don't properly mourn, then that unresolved loss can come out in unexpected ways such as fits of anger and lashing out at others, all of which are defense mechanisms to keep us far from our deep-seated hurts.

The Church, in her wisdom, knows that it is important to mourn and say goodbye. We Christians mourn with hope (cf. 1 Thessalonians 4:13). It is with this understanding that the Church ritualizes the process of mourning in her beautiful rites of a funeral Mass. I personally find great consolation through every funeral in which I participate. They are not merely sad gatherings, but events that challenge us to hope, seek counsel, and understand how great the gift of salvation is for those who die in the friendship of the Lord. The funeral Mass is ultimately our prayer to the Father for our beloved dead through the sacrifice and resurrection of Jesus Christ which conquered death and opened up the possibility for heaven.

Through the month of November, we are encouraged to pray for our beloved dead, for many are on their journey of being purified by the grace of God (a.k.a. purgatory) and could use our help as we accompany them on their way. To this end, I want to encourage you to consider writing the name of a deceased loved one in our Book of Remembrance which is located near our votive candles on the south side of the church. I also want to encourage you to consider attending any of our funerals regardless of whether you knew the deceased or not. It is a great spiritual and corporal work of mercy to pray and bury the dead.

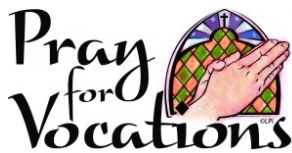

**CELEBRATING THE SAINTS**

**ST ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE (1769 - 1852)**, was



born in France and entered a convent at 19, but during the French Revolution cared for the poor and sick, opened a school for homeless children and helped underground Priests. Then she joined the Society of the Sacred Heart and came to the US to work among the Indians. In Missouri she founded the first free school for girls west of the Mississippi, and the first Catholic

Indian School. At age 72 she joined the mission at Sugar Creek, KS, among the Potawatomi, where she became known as “Woman who Prays Always.”

**From Pope Francis' Message  
for World Day of the Poor  
November 14, 2021**

**“The poor you will always have  
with you.” (Mk 14: 7)**

**The face of God revealed by Jesus is that of a Father concerned for and close to the poor.** In everything, Jesus teaches that poverty is not the result of fate, but a concrete sign pointing to His presence among us. **We do not find Him when and where we want, but see Him in the lives of the poor**, in their sufferings and needs, in the often inhuman conditions in which they are forced to live.

- **The poor evangelize us**, because they enable us to discover in new ways the face of the Father.

### Great News for St. Anne Catholic School

We have received a grant from the Carrico Foundation in the amount of \$115,000! Thanks to our amazingly talented, hardworking grant-writer Susan Hermes, we now have the funds to complete our plan to enclose the school campus, making it much safer for our students and staff and also making more of our campus available to the children in our licensed childcare program which includes our early childhood students, EC3 and EC4, along with all our students who stay for the after-school program, come during no-school days, and in the summer.

In addition to securing our campus with fencing and gates, we will also be able to put in the long-awaited track and field in the upper area of the parish property. There will be a french drain put along the back to fix the swampy area at the very top, fencing along the sides to block off the drainage ditches, and a fence along the side of the track and field to keep balls (at least most) from coming down the hill. We are also going to put the hill on the south side to good use by installing slides and climbing ramps with ropes and foot and hand holds. All of this will be able to be used by all of our students at all times with the fencing and gates installed. More play areas will be developed between the track and field that will be instrumental in the development of our younger students. And this will be a great benefit for the whole parish. Future youth groups will have a field to play on, and parish families who like to hang out after church and visit will have many areas for their children to enjoy.

St. Anne Catholic School is so blessed to have Susan Hermes who has written many grants for us over the years. These grants provide us with all our technology - iPads for all students, laptops and Chromebooks for staff and students, Promethean boards and document cameras for our classrooms, and most important of all, updating our outdated technology when needed. We have a brand new school refrigerator/freezer in the kitchen, just waiting for the school to be able to start serving hot lunches again, as well as new student desks (not arrived yet, but hopefully soon!) and classroom tables that are all paid for by grants. This is one of the many important things that allows us to provide an affordable, excellent and well-rounded education in a faith-filled and family-style environment for our students. We are so grateful for all the work Susan has done to provide us with these grants year after year. And we are always grateful for the continued support through prayers and finances from our parishioners. God is good and his blessings of this important ministry are ever-present. Even in these difficult times, he continues to show us the value and importance of the work we are doing in the lives of the children and families that we serve.

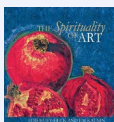

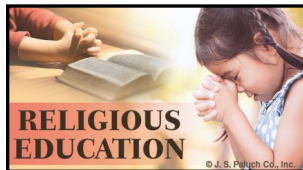

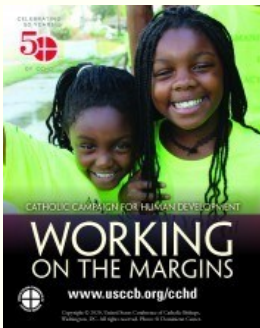

Giuseppe Moscati, "the holy physician of Naples," as a medical doctor and layman in the early twentieth century who came from an aristocratic family and devoted his medical career to serving the poor. His research also led to the discovery of insulin as a cure for diabetes. Moscati regarded his medical practice as a lay apostolate, a ministry to his suffering fellowmen. Before examining a patient or engaging in research, he would place himself in the presence of God. He encouraged his patients to receive the sacraments.

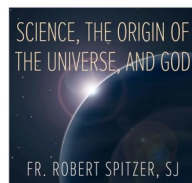

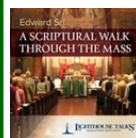
