FASTING AND ABSTINENCE
DURING LENT



All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday, & Good Friday.

All Catholics between ages 18 & 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

To fast means to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken for good health but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted; however, liquids including coffee, milk, & fruit juice are allowed.

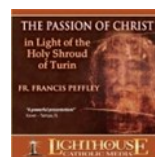

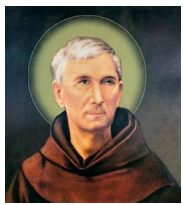

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS**ST LUDOVICO OF CASORIA (1814 - 1885)**, born near

Naples, was a cabinet maker before joining the Franciscans in 1832. After ordination he taught science and mathematics until 1847, when a mystical experience changed the direction of his life - to care for the poor and the infirm. He established charitable agencies, and schools and institutes for African children, for the disabled, and for the elderly. He also founded the Friars of Charity and the Sisters of St Elizabeth. He was Canonized by Pope Francis in 2014.

His Feast Day is March 30th

LOST AND FOUND

The parable of the father and his sons is one of the most familiar of all of Jesus' stories. The father in the parable is lavish in forgiveness and revels in the return of his young son, who was lost and now is found. The older son is also lost—lost in his refusal to forgive, lost in his failure to grasp his father's generous spirit. The Israelites spent many years lost in the desert, seeking the land of milk and honey, yet often failing to seek the God who delivered and fed them. We are sometimes lost as well. We lose sight of the Lord and the Lord's ways. God never loses sight of us, however. God waits, ready for us to come to our senses, ready to welcome us back with open arms.

Stations of the Cross for Ukraine

God of Peace, in Lent you draw us together to witness
the depth of your love for us. Allow that love now to
intercede in the invasion of Ukraine. Rescue your
children. Unite our family. End this war.

First Station: Jesus is Condemned to Death

Kateryna, from Lugansk: The Russian invasion began like a Soviet movie: At 5:15 AM I was woken up by the sound of a fighter jet. 15 minutes later we heard a terrible explosion and the house shook.

I ran to the nursery. The picture I saw will remain for me the main illustration of this war. My 10-year old son was lying by the bed on the rug, curled up, covering his head with his hands, and at the same time he was calm.

Lord, grant us a feeling of shock.

Second Station: Jesus takes up His Cross

Natalia, from Kyiv: On the morning of February 25 I did not plan to go anywhere. There was no talk of evacuation.

By lunchtime everything changed: I had thrown some things in the car, the children, our dog. Our eldest daughter refused to leave, my parents also stayed home. I will never forgive the occupiers for my mother's words: "We have already lived our lives. You save the children."

We understood the attack was a matter of time and were taught the Jewish wisdom of the Holocaust: "Believe those who say 'I want to kill you.'" And still it is impossible to be ready for this. The brain denies it.

Lord, grant us a feeling of dislocation.

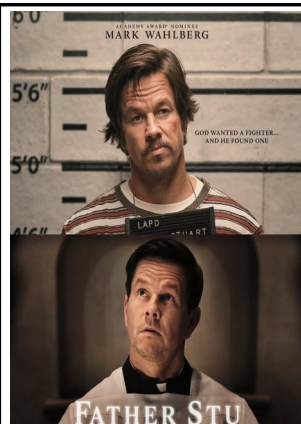

We are so pleased to share with you many things in the "good news" category. The first piece of good news is that starting on the Monday after spring break, dismissal will be back in person on campus! This has always been a wonderful time for families to get to know each other and for parents and teachers to get to know each other as well. We have greatly missed this important piece in community building at St. Anne and are very happy to bring it back.

In other good news, we have several campus projects that we have been wanting to do for many years. With new grants from the Carrico Foundation, the Early Learning Division, and the Archdiocese Safety First Grant, we are finally able to get many of these projects we have talked about for years completed! Thanks to Kirk Chapman, many projects we expected would not get done until the summer are already under way. When you come to Mass, check out the revamped courtyard that is being developed into some wonderful outdoor areas for our students. In front of the ECE rooms will be a large pea gravel area developed to extend their outdoor learning space. In the middle will be a grassy area that can be used by all classes. On the other side of the grass is a beautiful patio that will have new outdoor tables with umbrellas giving classes a year-round area to take learning outside and also for eating outside.

Other projects to be completed in the next few months are:

- a canopy shade over the lower playground to make it usable year-round
- fencing to complete the full enclosure of the school part of the campus
- security cameras throughout the campus with monitors in the office for a constant visual of the entire campus
- a security entrance to the school office which will allow staff to see and buzz in visitors and which will keep the front doors locked from the outside but unlocked on the inside
- a track and field installed on the top field at the back of the property
- additional outdoor learning areas developed between the upper playground and the track and field and behind the parish center next to the lower playground

As always, we are so grateful for the constant support of our parish and its parishioners.

If you would like to sign up for a specific hour during Exposition please call Julie Scott.



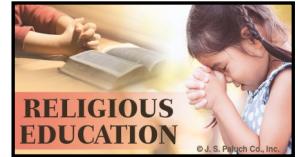
Since we have come to the end of our Capital Campaign, we are no longer using the purple donation envelopes.

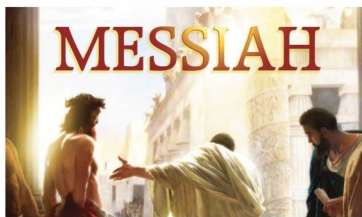

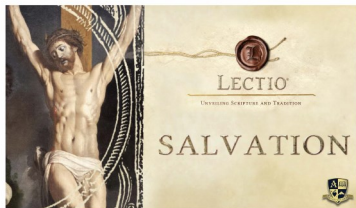

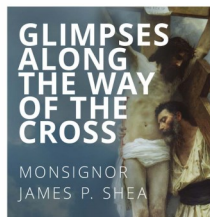
