A DEEP CHANGE OF HEART

When John proclaimed a baptism of repentance, as today's Gospel relates, he called people to a deep change of heart. For John the Baptist, repentance was not simply regret for past failings, but a commitment to orient life around God's desires and purposes. What might living in alignment with God's desires look like? Our readings offer some clues. Baruch indicates that when mercy and justice are embraced like a royal garment, we may see the fruits of repentance. Paul notes how the Holy Spirit has been active within the church in Philippi, forming them to live in a loving and united community of faith, so they may witness to the love of God. And John himself suggests that a repentant heart clears a path for God to enter, leveling the mountains and valleys of our resistance, so that God might dwell within.

A Note (or two) from Music Ministry:

You may have noticed a few more songs last week during Mass on the First Sunday of Advent. Antiphons are hymns or chants selected to go along with the readings for a particular day. GIRM (General Instruction of the Roman Missal) no. 48 provides a guide for the



Entrance Chant, with antiphons and psalms being the first three out of four preferences. "A suitable liturgical song" is the fourth option and the one most commonly used at liturgies. With the start of Advent, we are hearkening back to our roots as we move forward into the new liturgical year. At Saint Anne, we will be singing (or chanting!) antiphons before the Gathering Song and before Communion. Antiphons are traditional, beautiful, and backed by the instructions of the church. We hope they will help our congregation more fully connect with the liturgy.



LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE Civilize It: A Better Kind of Politics 5 Tips from Pope Francis

Pope Francis challenges us to respond to polarization and division by building "a better kind of politics":

A better kind of politics means working across differences to listen to one another and connect around shared values, resulting in creative solutions for the common good.

1. We are one human family

Instead of being concerned only with myself or my group's petty interests, we must commit to overcoming our individualistic mindset and seek the good of all people.

2. Approach others with love

Always honor everyone as made in God's image. This involves stepping outside of ourselves, listening with empathy and seeking to truly understand others.

3. Identify common values based on truth

An essential starting point is to identify common values rooted in truth and justice, such as the dignity of the human person, or a commitment to fundamental human rights.

4. Consider sources of information

Are my sources neutral or are they connected with a particular political party or bias? Can I check information against multiple sources to insure its accuracy before sharing it with others?

5. Be comfortable being a polyhedron (a 3-dimensional shape with many faces)

Authentic social dialogue involves respecting another's point of view, admitting that it may reflect legitimate convictions and concerns, and being frank and open about our beliefs while working for the common good. [usccb.org/civilizeit; Pope Francis, Fratelli Tutti]




