

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The wonderful diversity of life and worship among Roman Catholics of East and West is an example of God writing straight with crooked lines. The steady hand of the villainous Emperor Diocletian drew a line across Europe and Africa that split the empire in two, and for the most part determined how Christians would worship two thousand years later.

Italy's heel and the far northern city of Trieste fell on the Eastern side, and have had a form of Eastern liturgy ever since. Constantinople, which soon became the seat of the Roman Empire, became a base for Christianizing the East up to Russia and Poland. Poland was on the Eastern side, but a series of wars and medieval mayhem pushed the religious boundary back to the Ukraine, and Poland remains an outpost of the Latin Church to this day.

An old rule of thumb declared that whatever religion was observed by the local prince, the people had to follow. This gave rise to persecution and migration as people sought toleration for their expressions of faith. In the United States, we are accustomed to peaceful collaboration among Christians of East and West, a situation that challenges churches that still feel the pinch of age-old division.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS



ST MARY MACKILLOP (1842 - 1909),

aka St Mary of the Cross, was born in Melbourne and grew up in a family that struggled financially. In 1860 she founded a religious community - the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart - whose mission was to educate the poor, establish orphanages, and perform works of charity.

They also served the aborigines and unwed mothers. Mary had disagreements with local Church authorities and was briefly excommunicated for insubordination, but it was rescinded and she was completely exonerated.

Beatified by St John Paul II and Canonized by Pope Benedict XVI, she is Australia's first Saint and Patron Saint of Australia.

Her Feast Day is August 8

LIFE, JUSTICE, AND PEACE

Nuclear Disarmament UN Office for Disarmament Affairs

Nuclear weapons are the most dangerous weapons on earth. One can destroy a whole

city, potentially killing millions, and jeopardizing the natural environment and the lives of future generations through its long-term catastrophic effects.

- The dangers from such weapons arise from their very existence.
- Although nuclear weapons have only been used twice in warfare - in the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in 1945 - about 13,400 reportedly remain in our world today.
- Disarmament is the best protection against such dangers.

From Pope Francis' Message to the First Meeting of States Parties to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (June 21, 2022):

A world free from nuclear weapons is both necessary and possible.

- Catastrophic humanitarian and environmental consequences would follow from the use of any nuclear weapons.
- Nor can we ignore the risk of accidents that could lead to very troubling scenarios.
- The use of nuclear weapons, as well as their mere possession, is immoral.
- Possession leads easily to threats of their use, becoming a sort of "blackmail."
- The Catholic Church remains irrevocably committed to promoting peace and fostering education for peace.

I have felt blessed that quite a few parishioners have approached me after Mass the last few weeks to tell me they appreciated the bulletin entry I wrote. We are in a transitional time right now in our community. New priests, new staff, new challenges

and new blessings. We are still working out our new normal and many of the comfortable patterns we once had are simply not there any more. It's nice to be able to share our renewed vision on the family and our hope for the future.

My job is a new one here. Some may latch onto the youth ministry part of my title and imagine it to mean the same sort of youth ministry of our past. Well, first off, there are some big shoes to fill. I first encountered youth ministry under Patti Sanford and she and all the youth ministers since have contributed in different yet profound ways to the lives of young Catholics they encountered. Several of them I maintain communication with. When I was working in youth ministry in Washington, we would sometimes bounce ideas off one another. During the few decades of time that I've known our various youth ministers and youth ministry programs, the very state of youth ministry has changed. We find ourselves in that familiar space of: "new normal." Part of the blessing of that is a renewed focus on relational ministry within the life of the parish and not siloed or separate.





Our readings today explore how faith begins and how faith works. Faith begins with God's initiative of love, together with God's promise about the future. The passage from Hebrews urges readers to have an assured confidence in God, who promised and delivered a lasting legacy to Abraham. The book of Wisdom reminds readers of the God who promised and delivered freedom from slavery during the Exodus. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus begins with the promise that "your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom," before describing how to live faithfully during times when God seems absent. God's promises mean that God is fully invested in our future. Living in these promises, we can confidently let go of fear and insecurity. We can anticipate that when God intervenes in our lives, it will be for our benefit. And we can become God's partners in fulfilling these divine promises.
