

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Despite the fact that the feast of Christ the King was established less than a century ago, it has already undergone a shift in focus. When Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925, nationalism and fascism were on the rise. The pope intended that it be a “vehicle for spiritual teaching,” one that would recognize the ultimate authority of Christ over all political and social scheming. The last Sunday of October was chosen as the date for the feast because of its proximity to the feast of All Saints, those men and women who bore witness to Christ’s reign in so many different ways.

The calendar reforms of 1969 moved the feast to the last Sunday of the liturgical year. There, in the context of November’s focus on the end times, Christ’s second coming at the end of all time is highlighted. The threefold cycle of readings also expands our imaginations in regard to this feast. In this year’s Gospel, Christ stands before Pilate, whose own power blinds him to the truth of the Lord’s kingdom. In a world where oppression still holds sway over too many people, this feast is somehow still as timely as when Pope Pius XI first established it.

CHRIST, THE KING

The selection from the book of Daniel presented in today’s first reading was part of an attempt to weave a vision of ultimate success for the Jews under persecution. Exactly whom the author had in mind when he refers to “one like a Son of Man” is hotly disputed by scholars today. The fact is, we simply do not know if the author meant anyone in particular or if this is a collective, figurative image of Israel’s triumph. What we do know is that the early Christian community seized upon this passage and recognized it as a messianic prophecy, a foretelling of the ultimate triumph of Jesus as the Christ of God. The Lectionary’s juxtaposition of this text with today’s Gospel narrative of Jesus before Pilate is a wonderful example of how the liturgy “layers” passages with new meaning by inserting them in a particular context.

The celebration of Christ the King allows us to hear these passages with a new depth of meaning in light of our contemporary understanding of how, in Jesus and his resurrection and ascension, we have seen the fulfillment of Daniel’s vision of ultimate deliverance. The veiled admission of Jesus before Pilate that he did indeed have a kingdom “not here” takes on new meaning against the cosmic vision of Daniel, who allows us to glimpse the “Ancient One” on his heavenly throne.

At the beginning of Mass, the priest kissed the altar as a sign of greeting, a gesture of reverence for Christ. Now, the priest reverences the altar again, this time in a gesture of farewell. We gather our things and go forth as we entered—but not quite. Through our celebration of the Eucharist, we have renewed our commitment to service of Christ our King, and we go forth nourished, strengthened, renewed—changed.



THE ADORATION CHAPEL




CELEBRATING THE SAINTS**STS FLORA AND MARY OF CORDOBA (d. 856)**

were both born in Spain. FLORA was raised a Christian by her mother, who was married to a Muslim. Betrayed by her brother, also a Muslim, she was accused of apostasy but refused to renounce her Christian faith. The Islamic court ordered her scourged and turned over to her brother to turn her into a good Muslim, but she escaped and met up with MARY, sister of a martyred Deacon. Together they surrendered to the Islamic authorities, and despite being confined in a brothel, remained steadfast in their faith. Eventually both were beheaded.

The Principle of the **Universal Destination of Goods** is one of the defining principles of the Church's social doctrine.

- **The goods of creation are destined for the whole human race.**

- However, the right to private property does not do away with the **original gift of the earth to the whole of mankind**.
- **The universal destination of goods remains primordial**, even if the promotion of the common good requires respect for the right to private property.

Great News for St. Anne Catholic School

We have received a grant from the Carrico Foundation in the amount of \$115,000! Thanks to our amazingly talented, hardworking grant-writer Susan Hermes, we now have the funds to complete our plan to enclose the school campus, making it much safer for our students and staff and also making more of our campus available to the children in our licensed childcare program which includes our early childhood students, EC3 and EC4, along with all our students who stay for the after-school program, come during no-school days, and in the summer.

In addition to securing our campus with fencing and gates, we will also be able to put in the long-awaited track and field in the upper area of the parish property. There will be a french drain put along the back to fix the swampy area at the very top, fencing along the sides to block off the drainage ditches, and a fence along the side of the track and field to keep balls (at least most) from coming down the hill. We are also going to put the hill on the south side to good use by installing slides and climbing ramps with ropes and foot and hand holds. All of this will be able to be used by all of our students at all times with the fencing and gates installed. More play areas will be developed between the track and field that will be instrumental in the development of our younger students. And this will be a great benefit for the whole parish. Future youth groups will have a field to play on, and parish families who like to hang out after church and visit will have many areas for their children to enjoy.



St. Anne Catholic School is so blessed to have Susan Hermes who has written many grants for us over the years. These grants provide us with all our technology - iPads for all students, laptops and Chromebooks for staff and students, Promethean boards and document cameras for our classrooms, and most important of all, updating our outdated technology when needed. We have a brand new school refrigerator/freezer in the kitchen, just waiting for the school to be able to start serving hot lunches again, as well as new student desks (not arrived yet, but hopefully soon!) and classroom tables that are all paid for by grants. This is one of the many important things that allows us to provide an affordable, excellent and well-rounded education in a faith-filled and family-style environment for our students. We are so grateful for all the work Susan has done to provide us with these grants year after year. And we are always grateful for the continued support through prayers and finances from our parishioners. God is good and his blessings of this important ministry are ever-present. Even in these difficult times, he continues to show us the value and importance of the work we are doing in the lives of the children and families that we serve.
